



Message from the President

I am pleased to present our 2008 Annual Report about the activities of Childcare Worldwide.

Through the performances of our Ugandan Orphans Choir, our ministries received considerable nationwide exposure. Thousands of people across the United States experienced the exuberant songs and dances of the children. This resulted in an increase in children sponsored and income.

- Cash income rose by 20% to \$3 million
- Relief shipments increased by 38% to \$16 million
- The number of children sponsored grew by 30% to 4,068 children

Our relief efforts this past year were directed to the victims of the 8.4 magnitude earthquake in Peru.

Late last year the peaceful environment in Kenya was shattered by what amounted to a civil war following the disputed presidential election. Long festering hostilities between two major tribes erupted causing loss of life and property. The economy of Kenya may be severely affected for some time to come.

Our Life Center projects are in various stages of development in India and Kenya. It is our hope that these projects will not only bring economic and educational development to rural areas but be "Lighthouses" for the Gospel. Modified versions of the Life Center concept are planned for Haiti and Uganda.

Helping Children Survive



Children are the ones who suffer the most in any type of crisis or emergency because they are the most vulnerable. One of every four children in the developing world will die before the age of five from diseases related to malnutrition. To fight malnutrition and to lay the foundation for helping children succeed, Childcare Worldwide has developed several programs.

Feeding Programs



Regular feeding programs for needy children are the best and most practical way to fight hunger and malnutrition.

In Haiti, where the economic situation has gone from bad to worse, feeding programs are especially needed. In many areas, the soil is so poor that the people cannot grow food. This is aggravated by the steeply rising costs of groceries. To meet this urgent need for food, we have now started feeding programs in schools.

Survival Paks

Survival Paks with nourishing staple foods are given to especially needy families and orphaned children. In many cases, these food packages are literally 'life savers.'

We have a Survival Pak ministry in Uganda, Kenya, Peru, the Philippines, and Mexico.

The Critical Care Project makes a great difference in the physical and mental development of the children.



Critical Care Project

The most vulnerable segment of children are those under five years of age. In India, where malnutrition in this age group is a real threat to the lives of children, we started our first Critical Care Project with 50 children. Every weekday, they receive nutritious meals. Our doctors monitor their progress and take care of any medical needs. The Critical Care Project has been very successful and has also opened doors for a spiritual ministry.

Helping Children Succeed



Trade School

While the completion of elementary school is better than no education at all, the most promising and rewarding part of an education is receiving advanced training. By attending a trade school, either at one of Childcare's own schools or available local schools, students have the opportunity to learn a trade according to their abilities, talents and interests. Since the ultimate goal is for the young person to be employable, they are counseled in their choice of study subjects.

Individual child sponsorship makes it possible for children to survive and succeed.

MEDICAL MINISTRIES

India

A small hospital near Chennai in the state of Tamil Nadu gives medical help to the poor in the vicinity. Its doors are open around the clock. As an outreach into the rural areas, medical camps are held on a regular basis.

Kenya

Childcare Worldwide operates a clinic in the Maasai village of Olenkasurai and a clinic in each of the villages of Molos and Molok north of the town of Nakuru. All of these clinics are located in remote areas with no other medical facilities around. They continue to be life savers to these rural communities.

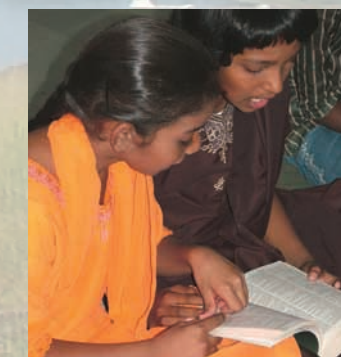

Everywhere Childcare Worldwide works, the proclamation of the Gospel is part of the program. The children have regular instruction in the Word of God in their schools, in children's homes or in combination with feeding programs.

In many areas, churches have been planted.

Ugandan Orphans Choir Helps Children Around the World



Two years ago, Childcare Worldwide started a special ministry through a choir of orphaned children from Uganda. These children, with their songs and traditional dances, came as ambassadors for thousands of AIDS orphans and other disadvantaged children, who have no one else to speak up for them.

In 2007 we hosted two choirs, one in the spring and another in the summer. Wherever they went, the children exhibited an amazing vitality and reflected the joy they have found under the umbrella

of Childcare and through their faith in Jesus Christ.

Altogether there were 124 performances during which 1,165 new children were sponsored.

Shipments to Peru During the Year 2007

In 2007 we shipped to Peru several containers of food, shoes, medicine, clothing, and blankets. The value of the shipped items was \$16,060,841.

Childcare Also Helps Earthquake Victims in Peru

In August of 2007, the southern part of Peru was struck by an earthquake of an 8.4 magnitude. Since most of the homes were simple adobe buildings, almost everything was reduced to rubble. The survivors suffered. They urgently needed food and blankets. Spring had not even started in these regions and at night it was still bitter cold.

Childcare Worldwide immediately went into action by sending several truck loads of staple food into the devastated area where the distribution was done through the Christian Missionary Alliance Church.

We also shipped a 20 foot container with food and a another container with winter clothing through the Children's Hunger Fund.

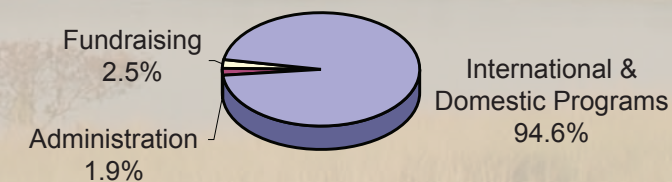
